Appendix-I

1) Title of the practice : Study Centres of Social Thinkers of India (Gandhi Study Center and Vivekanand Study Center)

2) Goal:

- To set up study centres of Epoch making social thinkers of India.
- To inculcate revolutionary and path breaking thought and action of social thinkers among students and people of this region.
- To collect this material in book and in audio visual format.
- **3**) The Context:

India has produced great thinkers and social reformers, who left a lasting impact on not only India, but on the world as a whole. There is a great need to acquaint the teacher, student and peoples with their thinking and with their work and to involve them in studies on social thinkers.

4) The Practice:

Gandhi gave a social dimension to the concept of nonviolence and demonstrated how it can be used as an instrument for fighting injustice. Swami Vivekanand thought that youths are the building blocks of the nation. College has received financial assistance from UGC to establish Gandhi Study Center and Vivekanand Study Center and spread the thoughts of these social thinkers amongst teachers, students and people of this region.

5) Evidence of success:

Both study centres have arranged various lecturers on thought of Gandhi and Vivekanand at nearby villages to Gunjoti. Street play was done at Murali, Kader, Gunjotiwadi, Betjawalga, Gugalgaon, Madaj, Ekurga etc. Seminars on the thought of these social thinkers were arranged. Study material on the social thinkers was collected in the Library and is open to all stakeholders for study.

- 6) Problems encountered and Resources Required.:
 - Poor response of the peoples due to economic conditions
 - Scarcity of funds to collect study material
 - Infrastructure is to be developed to run the study centres.

- 1) Title of the practice : Hypertension and Diabetes free Checkup Camp
- 2) Goal :
 - To inculcate social responsibility among the students.
 - To identify percentage of peoples suffering from Hypertension and diabetes.
 - To aware the people about the severity of these diseases.
- 3) The Context :

About 4% of the Indian population is suffering from hypertension, diabetes and communicable diseases. Survey on such diseases implies much attention to be paid about health and eating habits in rural population. Increasing percentage of these diseases is affecting on working efficiency as a whole and in turn productivity as well as financial status.

4) The Practice :

Survey and registration of peoples from nearby villages was done and 2000 peoples were registered for the free checkup camp Hypertension and diabetes free detection camp was organised at college on dated 18/09/2011. About 835 peoples from 12 villages took part in the camp and were treated by 32 doctors. Cipla, Raka Pharmaceuticals, Solapur, Mankind, Avinash Medical, Omerga, Tuljabhavani Medical, Omerga come forward and supported the camp.

5) Evidence of success :

Pre diabetes was identified in the 15% of peoples. Amongst 835 peoples 7% peoples were identified in hyper diabetic condition and 5% of peoples were suffering from hypertension. They were advised to consult Diabeticians immediately. 125 peoples have undergone for ECG.
