Appendix-I

1) Title of the practice: Research Publications

2) Goal:

To promote faculty and students for research and publication.

3) The Context:

Undertaking research projects improve academic as well as infrastructure status of the college. This in turn leads to creation of expert Human resources recognised Nationality and Globally. In view of this more focus is made to undertake research projects from university, UGC and industry. Faculty is also promoted to undergo specialised training programmes organised by academic staff colleges. Proposals under major and minor schemes of UGC and university are encouraged.

4) The Practice:

Principal, IQAC members and management encouraged faculty for enrolment of M. Phil, Ph. D and submitting major and minor projects towards UGC and University. Supervisors for Ph. D and M. Phil at university and research Institutions were requested to enrol college faculty. As per UGC norms management approved study leave for faculty. IQAC members helped faculty to frame projects for major and minor research scheme and screened the projects through research committee for improvement.

5) Evidence of success:

Among faculty 6 members availed FDP schemes, 4 major projects, 23 minor projects and 8 university projects have been sanctioned to staff in few years back. Now majority of the projects have been completed. Few are about to complete. Faculties after completion doctoral degree are being recognised as research guide. This has resulted into increase of publications qualitatively and quantitatively. This year because completion of 8 minor projects publication number has been considerably increased. Three projects fellows are working under major projects and are strength of college.

Faculty is enthusiastic in undertaking projects and publications which is supported by research committee and IQAC for qualitative improvement. Expert opinion and consultancy is also initiated to some extent.

6) Problems encountered and Resources Required.

Management of the college is eager to promote research activity in the college.in this context a proposal has been submitted to university for recognition of physics, chemistry and zoology laboratories as research centre. Tedious process and poor response from university and state govt. is time consuming. Many times technical difficulties such as only three years after Ph. D guide ship will be approved become hurdle. Impartial screening and qualitative approach needs to be considered. More autonomy is to given for researcher.

- 1) Title of the practice: **Personality Development Workshop**
- 2) Goal:

Work to uplift overall personality of students.

3) The Context:

In tune with the goal set and 150th birth anniversary of Swami Vivekanand it was decided to work specially for personality development of students. Swami Vivekanand study center and NSS unit of the college informed to plan activity accordingly. Vocational education department, Omerga taluka Saardh Shati Samiti were also called for active participation.

Vivekanand believed in truth he said, "100 youth having potential dedication character can turn the fate of nation." Character building, motivation with proper direction, morality and good citizenship are the key parameters where lot of work need to be done. In view of this personality development activity was organised.

4) The Practice:

NSS unit, Vivekanand Study Center in associations with vocational education department and Saardh Shati Samiti, Omerga activity was planned with aims to inculcate selfless attitude, importance of self-reliance, community service, character building, leadership role and development of skill based knowledge. For this activity Joint Director of vocational education, MLA from Teacher constituency, Swami from Pune, Ramakrishna Mission, Youth Social worker, experts and renowned personalities from Govt. and non Govt. forms were called upon. District vocational training and employment officials narrated the wide scope in self-employment and small entrepreneurship. Schemes and financial assistance available. Procedures for submitting proposal under entrepreneurship were also discussed during the workshop.

5) Evidence of success:

About 150 students and teachers were enrolled for workshop. Teaching and non-teaching staff also benefitted out this workshop. Students specially from vocational department learned about the schemes available from state and central Govt. some of them initiated entrepreneurship and filed the proposals for funding towards district youth welfare and entrepreneurship development office. Success stories of some of the alumni were presented.

6) Problems encountered and Resources Required.

Yet graduate and post graduates consider Govt. jobs are safe and secure, become entrepreneur oneself feels unsatisfactory and risky. This mind set is to change by wide campaign about self-reliance and skill development. Success stories of eminent personalities may be widely spread among students.
